2024 FAI CIAM Pylon Racing World Cup Report

Dear Racers around the World,

2024 has been a great year for international World Cup racing, and I would like to begin by thanking all the clubs and their members who hosted the races this year. We've had the privilege of racing at both the classic venues we all know and love, as well as new locations that warmly welcomed us. A huge thank you to all the hosts!

This year was especially exciting with **Australia** joining the World Cup series and **Qatar** hosting the closing race for the season. The global pylon racing community came together to race, connect, and celebrate, making 2024 an unforgettable year for all of us.

Throughout the seven World Cup races held across the globe, a total of **151 competitors** participated in our four classes: **F3D**, **F3E**, **F3T**, and **F3R**. This is a **50% increase** in participation compared to previous years!

Here are the number of participants in each class:

- F3D: 46 racers
- F3E: 28 racers
- F3T: 64 racers
- F3R: 13 racers

Race Scoring System

For those unfamiliar with the World Cup scoring system, the best three results from at least five races are used. Each country is allowed to enter up to two races, but only one result per country will count toward the World Cup score. A race is considered valid if at least two competitors from different countries make a valid flight. You can find further details on the rules in the FAI CIAM Code.

A special thanks to Bram Lentjes for his diligent work on the calculations. We now have the final World Cup standings for all classes. You can view this year's race results and your individual standing at https://www.fai.org/world-cups/f3pylonracing.

Please note, if you did not have an FAI ID, your FAI ID position will appear empty. If your ID was not valid for 2024, it will be highlighted in red. In such cases, your points will be marked as void and crossed out.

Special Mentions

A special mention goes to the **Metkemeijer** father and daughter team. **Margot Metkemeijer** decided in **Qatar 2023** to set a goal to compete in **F3R**. With Margot starting with zero model flying experience, the **Metkemeijer team** scored **59 World Cup points** in the **Qatar F3R race**. This is a remarkable achievement and an inspiration to all newcomers to the sport!



Improvements and Concerns

As we look ahead to 2025, there are a few areas we hope to improve:

- **Fuel Quality and Composition**: Inconsistencies have been noted, and we hope to see improvements in this area for the 2025 season.
- **Gyro Systems or Augmented Flight Controllers**: These are currently not allowed under the World Cup rules, We continue to monitor usage in aircraft by competitors to ensure fair competition.
- **FAI License and ID Number**: Competitors must have a valid **FAI license** and **FAI ID number**. This has been a point of concern this season, and we urge all racers to ensure they are properly licensed for future races.

Race Participation & Challenges

The total number of entries in 2024 was much higher than previous years, which is fantastic to see. However, we faced challenges, particularly with some racers not having a valid **FAI ID license**. This led to complications in calculating the World Cup results and, could cause the **cancellation of future races**, which can impact the overall standings. Racers without a valid FAI ID are crossed out in the overall standings in the 2024 results.

A reminder to all racers: You can obtain a valid **FAI license** through your **National Aero Club (NAC)**, and the cost is equivalent to that of a single carbon fiber propeller. Please make sure you have your **FAI license** for the **2025 racing season**!

We also look forward to seeing **greater participation** in the World Cup series from regions that have yet to host races, especially **Japan**, **Mexico**, **USA**, **Canada**, **Portugal**, and **Indonesia**. I know many of you are racing in these areas, and we are excited to see the World Cup expand to these regions in the future.



Final Thoughts

As we wrap up the 2024 season, I want to express my gratitude to all the racers, volunteers, and hosting clubs who made this World Cup season possible. It's been a year of great racing, camaraderie, and global connection. Let's keep this momentum going into **2025**, ensuring that we continue to grow and strengthen our pylon racing community.
